

College of Sciences FAQs for Programs and Activities that Involve the Participation of Minors - REG 01.25.18

1. Why has NC State adopted this <u>regulation</u>?

2. What types of Programs are covered by this regulation?

Types of programs and activities covered by the Minors Regulation can be found on page 9 of the <u>Youth Program Coordinator Handbook</u> and in Section 1.2 of the <u>regulation</u>. 3. What is the Youth Program Coordinator Handbook?

This <u>handbook</u> provides information on policies, procedures, best practices and standards for NC State University programs that host participants under the age of 18.

4. Who is considered a covered individual?

A Covered Individual is defined in Section 2.2 of the minor's regulation.

5. What is the Minors Regulation Training?

The minors' regulation training covers risk management best practices, procedures, and guidelines for all program activities. This training is required for NC State program staff who are providing direct supervision or custodial responsibility for the care, custody and control of minors. 6. Do I have to register my Program or Activity each year?

Yes. For programs and activities that involve minors, <u>registration</u> in REPORTER must be renewed at least annually.

7. Who is the College of Sciences Designee for approval of programs and activities involving minors?

The Dean's designee for approval of programs and activities involving minors is <u>Jason Painter</u>. In order to receive approval for your program or activity, you **MUST** <u>register</u> your program or activity. Please also review the College of Sciences Programs Involving Participation of Minors <u>webpage</u>. Once you've completed this, the program or activity will be reviewed by Dean's designee and the <u>Office of Youth Programs</u> and you will receive approval from the Office of Youth Programs and the Dean's designee.

8. If my Program does not fall under the Minors regulation, what is the next step?

9. What else do I need to know in order to prepare for my program or activity registration?

Background Checks and Reference Checks - REG 05.55.08

1. Who is required to have a background check?

2. When are background checks not required?

Invited guest speakers, guest lecturers, or guest instructors whose interaction with Minors is limited and only in the presence of a Covered Individual, are not considered Covered Individuals and do not need background checks. They should remain within line of sight of a Covered Individual.
